

FORNEY ISD HEALTHY PRACTICES

Forney ISD continues to monitor any health risks that arise in our community. The District receives regular updates and guidance from Texas Governor Greg Abbott, Texas Education Agency (TEA) Commissioner Mike Morath and other local, state and federal agencies regarding response, prevention, and mitigation efforts. Below are our health practices for the 2021-2022 school year. The plan is subject to change based on additional information and guidance from any of the above-mentioned agencies.



HAND HYGIENE

Hand sanitizing stations are available at all district facilities.

Staff will be expected to regularly wash or sanitize their hands.

Students will be required to regularly wash hands throughout the school day.



CLASSROOM CLEANING

Frequent cleaning and disinfecting will promote a healthy learning and work environment for students and staff.

Each classroom will have a hand sanitizer station.

Each classroom and restroom, as well as all high-touch areas, will be disinfected regularly.



COUGH ETIQUETTE

We ask that everyone cover their nose/mouth when they cough/sneeze.

Please socially distance when possible.

Face coverings for all students are encouraged, but remain optional.

Wash hands frequently.



STAY HOME IF SICK

Staff are required to self-screen for symptoms of illness, such as fever or vomiting, prior to reporting to work each day.

Parents are expected to screen their students for symptoms of illness, such as fever or vomiting, prior to sending their student to school.

Students who are ill will be separated from their peers and should be picked up within 30 minutes from the time the campus contacted the student's parent/guardian.
